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
**16 Niyatiya Cave**



## 20 Ernie Pyle Memorial

Ernie Pyle was a world-famous American war correspondent. He received a Pulitzer Prize for his reporting on the casualties, fears, and sorrows of the battlefields. Pyle lost his life as a pilot for Japanese forces in April 1945 while he was reporting on the battle of Okinawa. He is remembered by the U.S. military leader as a man who was honest, open, and every April Americans residing in the archipelago hold a memorial celebration.

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**22** Anti-War Peace Museum  
The Nuchi du Takara House

The words "Nuchi du Takara" in the language of Okinawans mean "life is a treasure." This anti-war peace museum was created by Aragon Shozo, a former activist who was engaged in the struggle against Okinawa for Okinawans and in the peace movement. Items exhibited at this museum include memoranda and daily necessities from wartime, along with ammunition and other items seized by U.S. forces. "Advance reservations required for talks about life during wartime."
